Page 3 Visit to Rosehaven Hospice Mansfield

The ANZAC visit to Mansfield incorporated a visit to Rosehaven Hospice in Mansfield, which was an eye-opening experience.

The establishment of Rosehaven was the vision of a local Real Estate Agent, Bob Appleby, with extensive support from the local community. It is set in 4.5 acres of beautiful gardens, close to the centre of Mansfield and local medical service. The residential facility was designed thoughtfully to accommodate residents in a comfortable, family environment, with access for patients with any type of mobility aid.

Rosehaven, which is funded largely by donations and sponsorship, offers a range of services for people needing palliative care or who are living with a life limiting illness.

Respite services are offered as either day respite, or overnight respite in the last week of each month. This care can be tailored to the specific needs of the client and the carer has the option of staying with them and being looked after.

Community outreach can take many forms: in home respite, advocacy, advance care planning, assistance with nagivating My Aged Care, memoir writing, walking animals/feeding, bin buddies, transport to appointments, cooking and personal care. In addition, there is a loan service for all sorts of mobility aids such as electric beds, lift chairs and scooters.

Rosehaven also offers end of life care, providing a caring and supportive environment for clients and their families, free of charge. Their approach is tailored to the needs of the individual—one illustration is that pets such as dogs are permitted to stay as a comfort for the client. It is

one of only two establishments in Victoria that will provide support with voluntary assisted dying.

The passion and 'person-centred' approach that is the philosophy underlying this organisation was very evident in information provided by our guides, Bianca, the Hospice Manager, and Alicia, the Manager of Grief and Bereavement.

In response to a statement about current needs for Rosehaven, Alan was able to offer them two used but entirely serviceable lap top computers for use by the memoir writers. A very interesting visit—thank you Marg for arranging it.

Cost: \$10 per head, tap-n-go is available.


