



Fr Bob Maguire Foundation—Paul Brophy

Paul Brophy gave a presentation from the heart this evening, in place of Fr Bob, who was unable to attend.

Paul outlined his background and his pathway to working for Fr Bob and his Foundation. Originally from Port Fairy, Paul trained in nursing, then moved into management of an aged care facility and worked for the Brotherhood of St Lawrence for a number of years. His experiences here were varied, such as working with the homeless and dealing with indigenous issues, which served him well when he moved to help Fr Bob in 2018.

A major activity of the Fr Bob Maguire Foundation is the running of a Community Pantry, located at 204 Gladstone St, Sth Melbourne.

The Community Pantry is open 4 days a week and gives out food and sanitary and hygiene products. It is manned by volunteers and helps around 40 people every day. Prior to COVID there were meals cooked and taken to a park in Port Melbourne where around 40-50 came for a meal. On Sundays the meal was in St Kilda and up to 150 people took part in this meal. In addition, legal studies students from Monash would come to to talk to people to provide legal information.

The food for the Community meals comes from Fare Share, Second Bite and Oz Harvest and what is not used is passed on to other agencies.

There are many emotional stories shared at the community meals as many people are finding times challenging and this is likely to become even worse in the future. The challenges of mental health issues and drug abuse are so widespread, across all segments of society. The Fr Bob Foundation does not receive any Government funding, although a recent visit by Anthony Albanese resulted in the commitment to provide a grant of \$300,000.

Project - Shoe Toss



The Club will shortly commence a sustainability project to support the organisation Tread Lightly, which works under the auspices of the Australian Sporting Goods Association (ASGA).

Tread Lightly is a national recycling initiative that takes unwanted sport and active lifestyle footwear and responsibly recycles it here in Australia to give it new life. The processing is done by Save our Soles and produces items such as flooring from the recycled shoes. The process is shown below.



OLD SPORT SHOES

Customer drops off preloved sports shoes at one of the 400+ collection locations at participating retail locations.



RECYCLING

Donated footwear is sent to the recycling plant here in Australia for sorting, breakdown and processing.



COMPONENTS EXTRACTED

Reusable components are extracted, including rubber, leather and fibres at the recycling facility.



NEW PRODUCTS

Reclaimed materials are used to manufacture new products such as gym mats, floors and playgrounds.

This project will involve:

- 1. An awareness campaign within the Club and local community, to increase awareness of the existence of Tread Lightly, to appreciate the value to the environment of using this scheme, to learn what can be donated and where the closest drop off points are.
- 2. A campaign for a month to collect shoes from our community of neighbours, friends and family, to take to the drop off points, to encourage a change of habit when dealing with worn out shoes.

The types of shoes accepted are: runners, trainers, golf shoes, hiking boots, thongs and slides, work boots, football boots, sneakers, formal leather school shoes. **More details coming soon**.

On Tuesday September 13th, Boronia Rotary Club has a special speaker, Frida Umuhoza.

Frida is an author and a survivor of the Rwandan Genocide of Tutsi people in 1994. She witnessed her family being massacred by Hutu men with machetes and was then asked how she wanted to die.



She could not afford a bullet for a swift death, which they offered to sell her, so instead she received what should have been a fatal blow to the head with a club. She was put in a mass grave with her slaughtered family only to find herself still alive and conscious, and she eventually climbed out. Frida's trauma will never be undone, but today she has an important message for the world.

Frida will recount how her life was totally transformed by the power to forgive and love her enemies. Despite great adversity, the message is one of immense hope and personal deliverance.

Fr Bob is notable as he treats everyone in the same way. He is passionate and can be fiery, but his focus is always on 'getting on with the job'.



He has no interest in clothes or other material possessions and sleeps in a chair as he has given his bed away to someone who needed it more!
