Rotary Community Groups- Murray Wilson

This week, Murray Wilson enlightened us about his new role as a Rotary Community Leader (RCL).

12 mths ago we discussed how we wanted to be integrated into a Rotary Community Group (RCG). We wanted to be part of Knox as well as looking a little further South. With the merge of Districts 9810 and 9820, District 9815 was formed and now includes 7 RCGs.

Our RCG contains the Rotary Clubs of Bayswater, Berwick, Casey, Cranbourne, Greater Dandenong and Endeavour Hills, Knox, Narre Warren, Noble Park Dingley, Oakleigh Clayton Huntingdale,

Rowville-Lysterfield, Rowville-Lysterfield Satellite, Springvale City, Casey Cardinia Rotaract, totalling approximately 250 members.

The first thing we need to think about is why there is a need for change. Zone 8, made up of Australia, NZ, Western Pacific Islands, PNG and up to Timor L'Este, has falling numbers. Whilst we are welcoming new members there are others leaving at a faster rate.

So our RCG is going to create our own growth plan and try to turn this trend around. The first meeting of the group was fruitful, with discussion about some of the issues, some of the desires and some of the really good projects that the clubs are doing. What we are trying to do is get collaboration between all the clubs to design a growth plan that is acceptable to all. Murray's job is to facilitate the group and pull people together along with resources they may need; to try to stimulate discussion and to ultimately foster partnerships between the clubs.

We need to have a big membership drive but we need to look at this from both internal and external aspects. How do we welcome visitors to our club? Is a multi club project the way forward?. The purpose of the RCG is to grow Rotary and Rotaract in the area covered by the RCG. Murray can get people together, but it's the members that have to be part of it all and have the desire to grow their club.

We need to increase our impact within the community and expand our reach. Also to enhance our participants' involvement, stimulate our own members, be ready to adapt as needed. We can't stay in our old ways. The days of traditional Rotary are gone. We have to be more flexible, more audacious in the way we interact with our members and the general public.

At the RCG meeting, there was talk about clubs collaborating on one big project with lots of ideas thrown into the pot. A detailed process to identify strengths and weaknesses eventually whittled down to about 10 possible projects that we could do as an RCG. One brand new project that we could all be involved in and then some smaller ones. Everyone voted and there were 3 projects clearly preferred over the others. Ideas were brainstormed as to how we could make it work, what resources would be needed, how to form a committee and it was even discussed if we are successful and make money, how will that be split up.

This whole trial is a 2 year project and at the end of that time clubs will be asked if they want to stay with the regionalisation or if we should return to the old system or try something new. Murray has 2

years to show that regionalization is working in our small area.

The times are definitely changing and there are exciting times ahead! Thank you Murray for your excellent presentation!

Part 2 of the meeting this week involved Murray giving us all a training session on the AED which was purchased by the Club and is housed on the wall at Tosaria's for community use if required.

AEDs are used to help those experiencing a cardiac arrest. It can analyse the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. The AED is designed to stop the patient's heart and then restart it. It will not do this if the heart is beating in Sinus Rhythm or if the heart has stopped beating.

Time is of the essence as the patient's chances of survival drop by 10% after every minute after collapse.



Murray took us through the guidelines with Andy happily laying down as the patient - check for danger, is the patient responsive, send for help/get someone to call 000, open the airway, check for normal breathing, commence CPR (30 compressions and 2 breaths), attach Defibrillator as soon as available and follow the prompts, continue CPR until responsiveness or normal breathing occurs.

CPR is a very tiring process for the person giving it so Murray suggested that having a few people ready to take over after 2 minutes is a good idea.

The AED instructions were very clear and there are also diagrams inside the lid to help with the process.

Murray reiterated that the machine will tell you what to do and will not shock the patient unless it is required. We do not need to worry about doing any damage to the patient as in Murray's words, "doing something is better than doing nothing."


