THIS WEEK'S MEETING— Ken Mirams—District Youth Protection Officer

Ken Mirams is a member of the Rotary Club of Beaumaris and District 9815 Youth Protection Officer and District Chair.

Why have a Youth Protection Policy?

- Required by Law
- Aligns with Rotary values
- Avoids incidents that damage Rotary and Club images.

Club Member must have:

- Current Working With Children Certification and Rotary training
- Submitted a signed Volunteer Declaration Form
- Three referees attached to the Declaration Form
- Approval from the members club
- Completed all required training

It is imperative that EVERY event involving children and youth under 18 years has a record of all attendees.

Each club should complete a risk assessment for EVERY event, especially events involving young people under 18 years of age.

- What are the likely consequences of an incident? High, Medium, Low
- What is the likelihood of an incident? High, Medium, Low

What to do if an incident (e.g. child molestation) occurs at a Rotary Event:

- Protect the child from further harm
- Report incident to the police
- Remove accused person from all contact with youth
- Report the incident to Rotary
- Protect the privacy of all concerned in the incident.

Victoria wide statistics for 2015-2016 show that there were 1500 substantiated incidents, with the following break down:

9400 - Emotional abuse

600 – Neglect

3000 – Physical abuse

2000 – Sexual abuse

Rotary provides a wide range of information and services. Youth polices are easy to understand, transparent and implemented by all Rotarians.

All new Club members should take part in Rotary Training in relation to Child Protection.






As we approach the Christmas season, it is timely to think about those who will not have the Christmas that we will have and reach out to them with some Christmas cheer.
