Home Club of PDG Daryl Moran



A hardy group of club members braved the Melbourne chill last Tuesday and ventured to Eumemmering for a very informative and inspiring presentation on the work of Disaster Aid Australia. This organisation is a project of the Rotary Club of Greater Dandenong and Π Endeavour Hills and was set up in 2010. The CEO, Brian Ashworth, and Director Cherie Ramsey, outlined the work of DAA and their Safe Water for Every Child projects. The visit included a demonstration of the Sky Hydrant which is central to the provision of clean water in developing countries in the Asia Pacific region. The sky hydrant comes in two sizes. The GEM Rapid Response Pack weighs 20 kg, costs \$2,500 and is designed for emergency use. It is small enough to be taken as checked luggage on a plane flight and can be set up within 2 hours, providing 5,000 litres of filtered water per day. The larger sized Sky Hydrants are intended for permanent sites and can filter 10,000 litres per day. Both types filter particles down to a size of 0.04 microns, which eliminates 99.99% of bacteria. Local people from the area where



the hydrants are installed are trained in the maintenance of the units, which involves cleaning the filter once a day through a simple process and a more involved process once a week to remove any build up of slime. The local people must also build a suitable structure to house the sky hydrant and have a strategy in place to replace the filter membrane after ten years. With this input from the local community, the residents gain a sense of ownership of the sky hydrant..... (Continued on page 3)

In recent years DAA has had an ongoing commitment to provide Sky Hydrants to every major school in Bhutan, working in partnership with the Rotary Club of Thimpu and the Ministry of Education in Bhutan. So far 130 have been installed, with plans to add another ten.

Another example of their work was in response to floods in Southern Thailand early this year. Within three days of the request for assistance, Brian was on a plane with 4 Gem Rapid Response Packs in his luggage. Over four successive days these sky hydrants were installed and locals trained in their maintenance, resulting in clean water for the local communities.

The work of DAA addresses all 7 of the Rotary areas of focus. Figures show that where a sky hydrant has been installed there has been a better than 70% reduction in illness in the local community. The flow-on effect is noticeable in terms of less absenteeism from school which leads to more effective schooling. The elimination of the need to bring in bottled water is a win for the environment in a number of different ways... the benefits go on.

The work of Disaster Aid Australia is truly inspiring with a very compelling outcome, that every \$1 donated can provide water for one person for a year!

Our Club is very happy to be able to donate \$500 to the work of Disaster Aid Australia.


