SOAP AID

For many of us, being able to wash our hands with a cake of soap is such an everyday occurrence that we barely give it a thought. This is not the case in many parts of the world and the consequences are significant. The World Health Organisation has determined that handwashing with soap reduces hygiene related illnesses by 40%. At the start of COVID, WHO also determined that 30% of people across the world did not have access to soap. Currently 4 billion people across the world lack access to adequate sanitation and 1.5 million children die from hygiene related illnesses per year.



These facts underly the work of Soap Aid, as outlined by our Guest Speaker this week, Carol Bellew, who is the General Manager Operations.

This organisation, which grew from a casual conversation during a plane journey in 2011, has the mission to collect and recycle partly used soaps from accommodation venues and to distribute the soap to those in need, both locally and overseas. Since its inception, it has processed more than 300 tonnes of soap and made 3 million bars. A 12 kg box of soap is enough to supply three families with soap for one year. The soap distribution process is also accompanied by education about the need for hand hygiene. This education is often delivered at primary school level with the expectation that children then educate their families. Since 2016, Soap Aid has supported the End Trachoma program in indigenous communities in northern Australia.

One part of the work of Soap Aid is the 'Hotels to Hands' social enterprise program. Hotels and other accommodation venues pay a subscription to Soap Aid to recycle their partly used soaps. This gives hotels a focus on corporate social responsibility and is often endorsed strongly by the staff at the venue. Unfortunately, the trend towards bottled body wash and the like in hotels is an impediment faced by Soap Aid, but they are active in communicating the benefits of using hard soap. Amongst these benefits is minimizing the use of plastics and the CO₂ emissions that come with manufacturing plastic.

Eighteen months ago the recycling plant at Dandenong was established, which works with "The Bridge' to provide jobs for people who need assistance in finding employment.

Soap Aid is funded partly by the 'Hotels to Hands' program but also by donations and fundraising activities. It has developed excellent partnerships with Government, Corporate and Community partners and particularly with Freight Partners who collect from all over Australia. The current goal is to raise \$120,000 by November 2024, which will enable even more soap to be recycled and distributed.




