This week's speaker—Caitlyn Smart (RYLA)



Caitlyn was accompanied by her father, Paul, and supported by seven other RYLA participants or leaders. The presence of these young people brought a lot of energy to the room but was also testament to the bond that develops over the weeklong program.

Caitlyn summarized the week as a life-changing experience and gave a heartfelt 'thank you' to the club for making it possible.

The activities undertaken during the week were many and varied, from guest speakers on topics such as public speaking and how to negotiate to achieve an outcome of benefit to all concerned, to emotional intelligence and developing relationships.

The team building activities were often physical, such as an Amazing Race component, or tackling the low ropes course or giant swing. One of the most valuable parts of the day was the 'Toolbox' session, which gave participants time in their Colour Groups to reflect on the day, to comment on aspects they were enjoying or struggling with and to further build their connections.

A Transilluminator is a medical device which uses strong LED light to make veins and arteries more easily visible in the bodies of tiny premature babies, making access to these blood vessels so much easier for the insertion of IV lines.

Presentations by ex-RYLArians on what they had done with their learning from RYLA over their life since were quite inspiring and prompted Caitlyn to think about what she had learnt and the impact of the week on her future path. She reflected that she now would have the confidence to use her own leadership style to be a leader and that she had a clearer idea of what her values are and what is important to her. A further take-away was realizing the importance of time management and, in particular, avoiding overloading herself, recognizing when she needs to step back and take a break.

While Caitlyn has had a lot of leadership experience in the past, being a Queen's Scout and former School Captain, she felt that she was able to learn something new in every session. She now has an outlook to use every experience as a chance to learn and recognizes that everyone you deal with is someone you can learn from.

There is no doubt that Caitlyn was an excellent RYLA candidate and we thank her for her enthusiasm and willingness to share her insights with us.


