WHEELCHAIRS FOR KIDS



A wonderful meeting was held this week, with a visit from the EarlyAct club members from Park Ridge Primary School, plus three of their teachers. These young people were very attentive as they listened to a presentation from Rotarians Grant Klaaysen and Russell Hayes about the project 'Wheelchairs for Kids' (WfK). This project commenced in 1996 due to the vision of a Rotarian after had seen the difficult conditions in which disabled children live in various parts of the world. Since that time, over 62,000 wheelchairs have been manufactured in a factory on the outskirts of Perth and have been shipped to over 90 countries. The organisation has over 800 volunteers who themselves gain great benefit from being involved in such an impactul project.

The wheelchairs, which weigh around 20 kg, are very rugged and tested to ensure they are suit able for all types of terrain. Various improvements over the years of the program have resulted in features such as puncture proof tyres. The children who are to receive the wheelchairs are identified by a disability agency in their home country and the wheelchairs are provided free of charge, with the additional comfort of a warm knee rug and a teddy. The wheelchairs are fitted by a trained clinician such as an occupational therapist and the adjustments that are available ensure the wheelchair will still fit the child as they grow.

There is no doubt that receiving a wheelchair is not only life changing for the recipient but in fact has enormous impact on the whole family and the community in which they live.

The cost of manufacture for each wheelchair is \$275. Shipping the wheelchairs to where they are needed is one of the biggest financial challenges, with some help available through organisations such as World Vision US, who help ship to African villages.

WfK is keen to spread the word about this valuable service, working with the premise that while they cannot solve the issue of mobility for all the disabled children in the world, to help even one child can mean the world to them.



We look forward to being able to support WfK and thank Grant and Russell for their time and for the ongoing work they do for this amazing organisation.

THE IMPACT OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

The question has been asked on occasions 'Why should I join Rotary and pay a subscription to work as a volunteer, when I can do that for free with other organisations?'

One significant reason is the access to The Rotary Foundation and the grant money that it makes available. Many grants match club money one-for-one, but by leveraging the links with other clubs and Districts across the world, the multiplying factor can be far more than that.

As an example, the completion of the recent Kiriwina Safety Boat Project was at a cost to the Club of \$4,600. Contributions from a District Grant of \$3,400, from another Rotary club in our area and from some individuals brought the total value to \$11,050.

Also, at the moment there is an application for a Global Grant underway for Family Care Uganda which will commit \$12,080 of Club money to a project that will gain total funding of \$54,360.

The impact gained from this allocation of funds, especially in areas of the world such as Kiriwina Island and Uganda, is enormous. The lives of many are changed for the better by our involvement in this process.

This impact becomes even more significant when we look at the figures over the last ten years. For the projects completed over this period, the Club contribution has been \$42,314.00, for a total value of project work of \$254,878.00. If we assume that the grants submissions that are currently underway are approved, the total will then become - Club contribution to the projects \$54,314.00

Projects total \$329,878.00

It is hard to visualize quite how much impact this money will have had on the recipients but there is no doubt that it is so much more than just helping at the local soup kitchen.
