This week's presentation - Rowville CFA - Remotely Piloted Aircraft Systems (RPAS)

The meeting featured a presentation by Captain Cien and some of her team from Rowville CFA about their innovative drone program.

Cien has been a member of the Rowville CFA for 16 years, and as Captain, leads all operational and administrative functions of the brigade. Her duties include commanding incident responses, overseeing weekly training nights, Sunday duty crews, brigade and group meetings and ongoing member development.



She manages communications, regulatory compliance, CFA policy implementation, and community engagement activities. On top of this she is an Air Traffic Controller at Moorabbin Airport and has a young daughter.

With all this on her plate, you would think Cien would have little free time, however, she has championed the creation of the CFA's first Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS) drone program. The Rowville Brigade developed and submitted an initial business case to introduce the use of drones in August 2019 and went through about 50 reworks and 9 iterations of submissions before it was accepted and approved in May 2024. Pilot training started soon after and it became operational in March 2025.

The original conditions applied were that the Brigade had to fund and purchase all necessary equipment and training of Pilots and Observer/Drivers. The project was deemed a trial for one year subject to a formal review and coverage was limited to areas within a one hour drive of Rowville base.



The humble beginnings of the Rowville CFA which was founded in 1942 by the local community with just a trailer pump towed to the fire site, seems very primitive when looking at the potential of RPAS in 2026 and beyond.



As part of CFA Aviation, the introduction of an RPAS response, will give Incident Controllers another tool to use on the fireground, in rescue operations and surveillance of dangerous/damaged structures.

Incident Controllers and Centres will be able to get a birds-eye view of situations and live streaming of imagery will provide the Controller with safer tactical deployment of resources, trucks, equipment and specialists. It will be very beneficial in areas of rugged and difficult terrain as it can see over hills.

In terms of rescues, RPAS has day and night capabilities with thermal imaging and enhanced video footage to assist in locating people. It has a speaker system to communicate with people in need of rescue and torchlight to help locate personnel and guide rescuers. It can be used in Hazmat incidents by gathering information without the need to send members into the danger zone. For example, identifying hazardous materials and potential dangers of gas cylinders, chemicals and fuels. It also has gas detector attachments so crews do not have to enter the hazardous area to obtain readings.

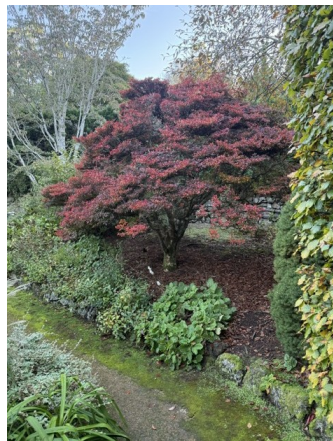

VISIT TO CLOUDEHILL GARDEN

A glorious autumn day was an ideal time for a visit this week by a group of Rotarians to Cloudehill Garden in Olinda. The visit started with a talk on bonsai, while viewing many examples of this amazing art form. Some of the bonsai had been tended by our guide, Jeff, for more than two decades. We learnt that many different types of trees are suitable for bonsai and the skill is to shape the growth by careful pruning and use of wires. Not only are bonsai sold at Cloudehill, but there is also a service to tend bonsai as they grow, plus many of their specimens have been used in movies and exhibited at the National Arboretum in Canberra.



Following this, the owner of Cloudehill, Jeremy Francis, accompanied us on a walk around the garden, providing a lot of information about the history of the garden and the trees themselves. Many were brought from overseas and some are over 100 years old. The 5 acre garden is beautifully laid out with paths, ponds and statuary. It was evident that a visit to Cloudehill at various times of the year would reveal seasonal beauty; for this visit the autumn toning of the beech and maple trees was stunning. RPAS PRESENTATION Cont'd.....

As well as being deployed in firegrounds and search and rescue operations, RPAS has proven useful in assisting the SES in times of floods and storms. During floods one of the biggest risks is ground instability. Drones can go ahead and find problems whilst crews are in safe zones. This allows for use of crews where they are most needed and more efficient use of skills.

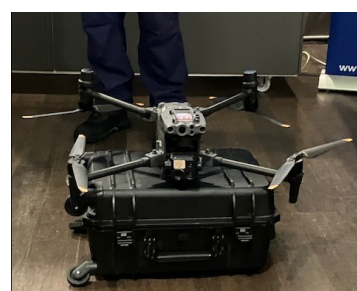
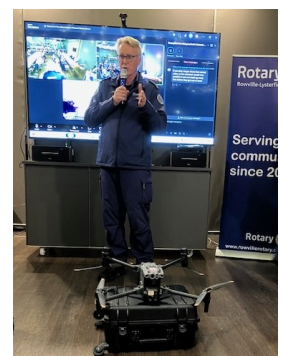
During fire investigations, the RPAS assists investigators to do a risk assessment before entering a building and can take photos and videos of the area undisturbed. Safety of burnt structures is crucial before investigators enter. The drones can also check for hotspots prior to returning property to owner/occupiers.

The drones, visual streaming, and communication technology are evolving very rapidly and producing greater opportunities for field use. The capacity and capability for use of drones in emergency services is unlimited. RPAS will now be rolled out to other Brigades, Districts and Regions thus expanding this asset throughout Victoria. The experience and personnel Rowville Brigade has, is well placed to lead and drive the rollout to other Regions.

RPAS is now an accepted specialty of the CFA and Rowville is designing the first RPAS vehicle. The vehicle will be the blueprint for the next generation of Drone use in the CFA and is just the beginning. Rowville CFA will bear the cost of the equipment used in this vehicle. This includes energy management including solar, connectivity, information distribution, and equipment storage/mobility.

Next week, as part of club planning for 2026/27, Andy will be enlightening us about some possible ways that we may be able to partner with Rowville CFA and assist them with the development of their vision.

We thank Cien and her team - Sam, Ian W, Ian H, Mark and Praneel for their time in sharing their stunning project with us in such an entertaining and informative way. The energy of the group was palpable and spread throughout the room, which was the fullest it has been for a regular weekly meeting. We look forward to working more closely with you in the next Rotary year and beyond.

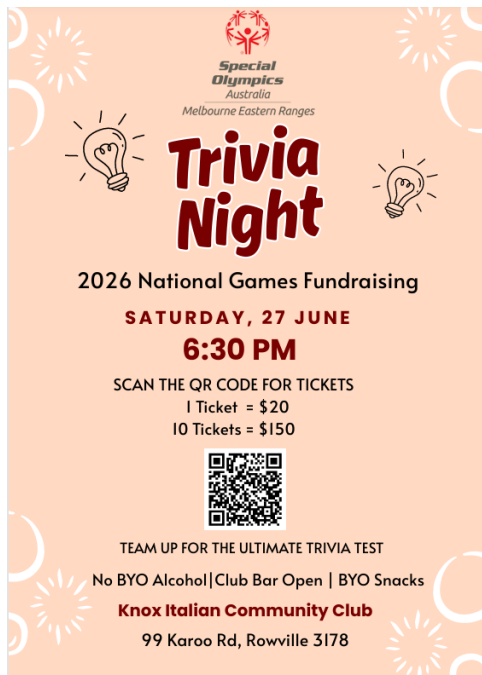

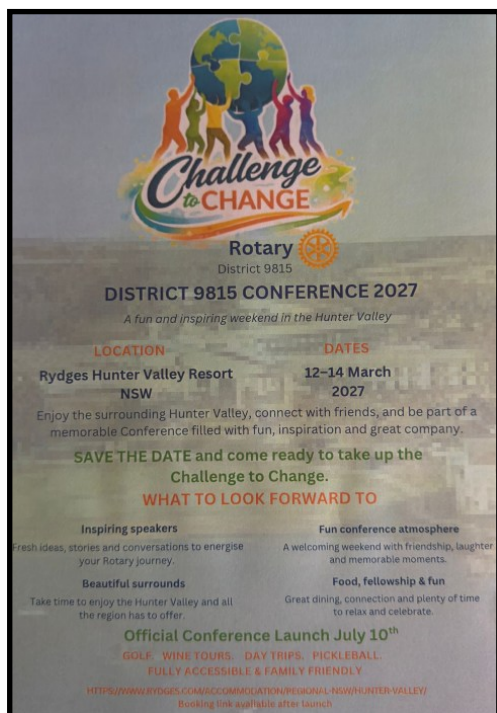
