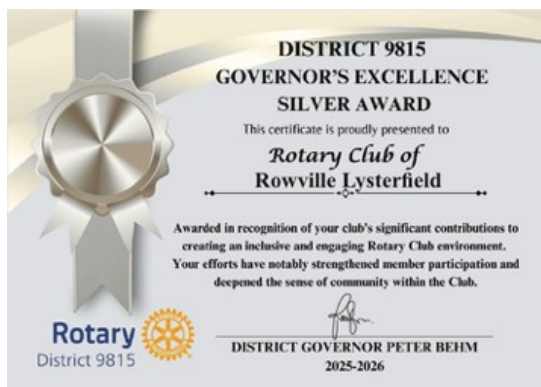
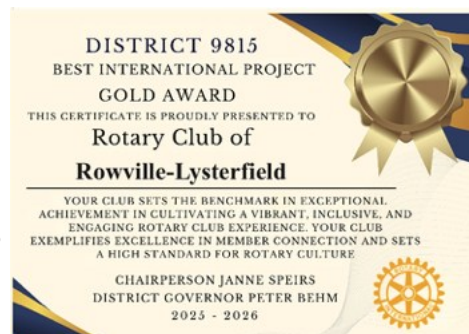

This week's meeting.....

With our planned guest speaker, local bee expert Michael Johnson, sidelined by ankle surgery, this week's meeting took on a different shape. The evening unfolded into a rich mix of recognition, updates and a thoughtful look at how we serve our community.

The night began with some outstanding news. Last Friday evening at the President's Meeting, our club was awarded the **District Gold Award for International Projects** — and not one of several, but the *only* gold across the entire district. Through the work of Satellite Club member Jen Luu, supported by Alan and others, our international project in Cambodia was judged the best in the district. A loud “Go Satellite Club!” summed up the mood in the room.



On top of that, the club also received a **District Silver Excellence Award**. As was said with a smile, we don't do what we do for rewards and recognition. However, whilst service is the heart of Rotary, it's encouraging to see our efforts recognised amongst our peers. Well done Rowville-Lysterfield Rotary!

Jenny reported on the hugely successful Girls' Night Out, which raised **\$8,000** for the Julia Argyrou Centre for Endometriosis Research. The new venue proved an excellent choice, with great feedback on the room, food and service. A long list of members were thanked for roles ranging from sponsorship and raffle management to flowers, balloons and the now-traditional “tuxedo t-shirt” waiters. Planning has already begun for next year's 10th event, with a target of \$10,000 firmly in sight.

The meeting then shifted to a more strategic focus with the introduction of a Community Assessment for Rowville and Lysterfield. Andy outlined the plan to use Rotary International's tools and templates to fully understand who lives in our area, what they care about, and where Rotary can genuinely add value. The assessment will combine conversations, surveys and data research, matched against our club's capabilities so we don't over-promise or set ourselves up to fail. Members were invited to join the Community Assessment team — with roles ranging from talking to locals to quietly analysing ABS and council data at home. Anyone who would like to be on this important committee is asked to please contact Andy.

THIS WEEK'S MEETING (CONT'D) SHEBA UPDATE - DR. SHARIF

After dinner, the meeting shifted to a more global focus as we welcomed Dr Sharif, who provided an inspiring and informative update on the remarkable work being carried out through SHEBA, our long-standing partner organisation in Bangladesh. For newer members, this partnership has been running for 12 years, and the impact achieved with relatively modest funding continues to be extraordinary.

Dr Sharif began by sharing news that the club's support has helped establish a new primary healthcare centre on the outskirts of Dhaka. The clinic now operates six days a week with both male and female GPs, offers after-hours care, and provides heavily discounted pathology and ultrasound services. A monthly childhood immunisation clinic has also been launched in partnership with the government, along with weekly outreach visits to surrounding villages.

Dr Sharif spoke about the sewing training centre in Dinajpur, where unemployed women are learning skills to establish home-based micro-enterprises. Thirty-five women have already graduated, with more in training. The vocational scholarship program is also thriving, supporting nursing and paramedic students into secure employment.

A major highlight was the announcement of Blindness Prevention Program – Phase Two, delivered in partnership with global eye-care organisation Orbis. The goal is ambitious: to make the local government area of Koilail cataract-free by February next year. All surgeries, transport, lenses, follow-up care and hospital costs will be provided at no charge to patients.

Dr Sharif also shared the results of the club-funded \$1 Screening Program, which tested 2,500 people for diabetes, hypertension and kidney disease — many for the first time in their lives. The findings were so significant they were published in an international medical journal and widely reported in Bangladeshi media.

The good doctor, also invited us to the annual SHEBA fundraiser, scheduled for later this year in October/November. It is always a fun night where our Rotary Club is held in very high regard and those gathered show their appreciation of our assistance and support of the SHEBA program and the far reaching, valuable work that it does.

The room responded with warm applause and deep appreciation for Dr Sharif's leadership, compassion and tireless commitment. As was said on the night, "He may not be the tallest man in the room, but he leaves the biggest footprint."

We thank Dr. Sharif for sharing all the current news with SHEBA and the wonderful things that are being achieved in Bangladesh under his direction.

Aim	Design and construct model bridges to support a trolley carrying 'gold' ingots across a gap in the tracks.	A computer science scheduling activity. Students arrange tasks in the most efficient way possible.	Create functional codes that accurately and efficiently send secret messages using pulses of coloured light.	The power is in your hands, the task is to provide the lowest cost electricity to ElectraCity's infrastructure.

KNOX BUSINESS AWARDS



Nominations and referrals are **NOW OPEN** and John W stressed the importance of our club members thinking about which businesses they would like to nominate. He has been busy visiting many Rotary clubs in the area to encourage them to nominate their own businesses or to refer businesses they know.

John discussed the Awards and highlighted the three methods for businesses to participate:

First, a referrer can nominate a business by filling out a form, which prompts an email to the nominated company.

Second, businesses can apply directly for specific awards, with questions tailored to the chosen category.

Lastly, the People's Choice Award is open to all businesses, allowing anyone to vote once for multiple businesses.

The Knox Business Awards recognise businesses in four categories: Community Champion Award, Customer Excellence Award, Innovation and Growth Award and Young Business Leader Award. The system automates the nomination process, making it simple for the public to promote the awards.

John showed us the website and how easy and streamlined the process is and hopes that we can all become involved to some level.

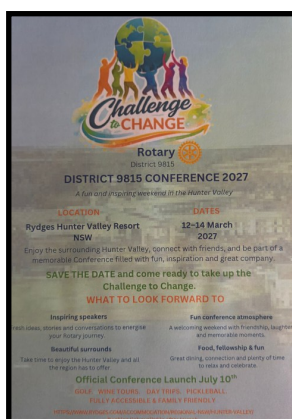
