Latest Market News



A huge thank you to all the wonderful volunteers - Jeff, Andy, Kevin, Cheryl, Alan, Robyn L., Gary, Kath, Kaye, Corinne, Robyn W., and our RYLA Candidate- Liam under the leadership of Bob and Heather.

Being the long weekend, it was difficult to predict what would happen. However the weather was fine and the stallholders were happy that we were holding the market, despite it being a long weekend. There were 28 stalls inside and 3 outside with 3 brand new stalls inside. Jeff had propagated several plants and sold them. He made a profit of \$62.00 and is donating that to the Market profit making a total of \$452.30 for the day with 454 people through the doors.

It was unfortunate that a few of the outside food vendors let us down and were a no show. Also 8 stallholders who had made a verbal commitment to be at market, didn't end up booking.

Moving the BBQ into the kitchen was a good move re not having to transport and set up the marquee and barbeque. However it didn't attract many sales. Customers were mostly the Stallholders. More and larger signage is probably needed in the hall for the general public to realise we are there.

Egg and bacon rolls were really all that was wanted. Very few hotdogs were sold so we have plenty in the freezer for next time.

The electric signs on Stud Road which have attracted many visitors to the market, were vandalised during the week - possibly on Thursday, so there was no signage after that.

The vote on the continuance of the market for the next 6 months was supported by 75% of members who voted. At the 21st July meeting, there will be a review of each of the markets so far, covering the good, the bad and the ugly. There will also be a spreadsheet shared showing all the tasks performed by Heather and Bob and how long each task takes. This will be distributed a week prior to the meeting so that a decision can be made as to whether we continue with the market after December and tasks can be allocated to those who wish to take them on.

There will be a further review of decisions made at this meeting again in December.

Thank you again to our members who continue to support this Community Service Project.

KNOX BUSINESS AWARDS



Nominations and referrals are **NOW OPEN** and John W stressed the importance of our club members thinking about which businesses they would like to nominate. He has been busy visiting many Rotary clubs in the area to encourage them to nominate their own businesses or to refer businesses they know.

John discussed the Awards and highlighted the three methods for businesses to participate:

First, a referrer can nominate a business by filling out a form, which prompts an email to the nominated company.

Second, businesses can apply directly for specific awards, with questions tailored to the chosen category.

Lastly, the People's Choice Award is open to all businesses, allowing anyone to vote once for multiple businesses.

The Knox Business Awards recognise businesses in four categories: Community Champion Award, Customer Excellence Award, Innovation and Growth Award and Young Business Leader [Award](#). The system automates the nomination process, making it simple for the public to promote the awards.

John showed us the website and how easy and streamlined the process is and hopes that we can all become involved to some level.

It is a sanctuary where the lonely, the isolated, and the forgotten can step in off the streets at almost any time to find a hot drink, a shared table, and radical inclusion. In a world where **the rising cost of living is pushing more families to the brink**, the Hub ensures that a safe, nurturing space is always within reach.



But expanding our care to six days a week means we cannot do this work alone. The increasing demand on our resources means the importance of partners joining us has never been more critical.
